Notes:

- 1. Student who select BIO 117 and BIO 118 as recommended in the second and third semester are not required to take BIO 111. Students planning to take BIO 117 and BIO 118 have the option of selecting a free elective in place of BIO 111.
- Students should select CCC's BIO 117. BIO 117 transfers to Temple as KIN 1223: Human Anatomy & Physiology I and satisfies a
 major requirement. Alternatively, students who complete both BIO 211 and BIO 212 will have satisfied the requirements for KINS
 1223 and KINS 1224 via DARS exception.
- Students should select CCC's BIO 118. BIO 118 transfers to Temple as KIN 1224: Human Anatomy & Physiology II and satisfies a
 major requirement. Alternatively, students who complete both BIO 211 and BIO 212 will have satisfied the requirements for KINS
 1223 and KINS 1224 via DARS exception.
- Students should select HIT 120: Medical Terminology for their free elective. HIT 120 fulfills HIM 1101: Medical Terminology a
 major requirement at Temple. Students transferring without this course will need additional semesters at Temple to complete the
 degree.
- Camden students must pass the HIM department's Computer Competency Exam before entering the program to meet the CIS
 1055 requirement. Once students successfully complete the exam, Temple University academic advisor will post "Requirement
 Complete" DARS exception.
- 6. Students who complete the A.A. for Liberal Arts and Science, Pre-Nursing Option are included in the CCC-Temple GenEd-to-GenEd Transfer Agreement and therefore have satisfied all of the GenEd requirements at Temple. Students should work with their CCC transfer advisor to select approved courses to fulfill the CCC degree requirements.
- 7. HPM 2214: Politics and Payment in US Healthcare System and HIM 2215: Health Care Information Management IT Fundamentals must be completed at Temple during a summer semester before students are accepted in the HIM Program at Temple. Alternatively, students can complete these courses through Temple's Office of Continuing Studies during the fall or spring semester prior to beginning the HIM program. A grade of C or better is required for all HIM prerequisite and professional courses.
