Notes:

- 1. To ensure students are eligible to transfer under the terms to Temple's GenEd-to-GenEd agreement, they must complete a mathematics course equivalent to Temple's QA/QB level math. Courses that satisfy this requirement include: MATH 115, 116, 117, 118, 120, 125, 140. Students who transfer without the recommended Mathematics courses will be required to complete Temple's 45+ General Education requirements and will require additional time to degree completion.
- 2. Any foreign language may be taken except American Sign Language.
- 3. For certification, the Pennsylvania Department of Education requires a minimum number of credits in the areas of Social Studies, Mathematics, Science and Language Arts. It is recommended that students select from the recommended courses to meet these minimum requirements.

Clearance and Testing Notice:

In order to register for 3000+ level teacher education program courses, students must have passed the Basic Skills Assessment test criteria set forth by the Pennsylvania Department of Education. Namely, students must have earned minimum scores in one of the following tests: SAT, ACT, PAPA or Praxis Core Academic Skills for Educators. Students must also be in compliance with the College of Education clearances policy.
