- Introduction to Literature and satisfies a major requirement at Temple. Students transferring without this course may require additional time to degree completion.
- 4) Students should select EN 203: Introduction to Drama. EN 203 transfers to Temple as ENGL U*** upper level elective and satisfies a major requirement. Students transferring without this course may require additional time to degree completion.
- 5) Students should select SC220: Intro to Geology. SC 220 transfers to Temple as EES 2001: Physical Geology and satisfies a major requirement. Students transferring without this course may require additional time to degree completion.
- 6) Students should select EN 205: Literature of the Sea. EN 205 transfers to Temple as ENG 2000: Special Topics and satisfies a major requirement. Students transferring without this course may require additional time to degree completion.
- 7) Students should select MA 101: Algebra & Trigonometry. MA 101 transfers to Temple as a Math L*** lower level elective and satisfies Temple Quantitative Literacy (GQ) General Education requirement. Students transferring without this course may require additional time to degree completion.

- c) Temple University requires that all undergraduate degree candidates complete 45 hours of the last 60 hours of the degree or program as matriculated students at Temple University. If a matriculated student previously took Temple courses on a non-matriculated basis, those courses are counted towards this requirement.
- d) Per Temple's Transfer Policy for <u>Permission to Complete a Course at Another Institution after Matriculation</u>, students who transfer 60 credits or more cannot receive permissions to transfer additional course work
- e) Students may seek a waiver of the foreign language requirement on the basis previous experience.
