- d) Kinesiology content courses must be selected from a prescribed listed of approved options. Students cannot use Kinesiology transfer elective credit to satisfy a content course area.
- e) Temple University requires that all undergraduate degree candidates complete <u>45 hours of the last 60 hours of the degree or program</u> as matriculated students at Temple University. If a matriculated student previously took Temple courses on a non-matriculated basis, those courses are counted towards this requirement.
- f) Per Temple's Transfer Policy for <u>Permission to Complete a Course at Another Institution after Matriculation</u>, students who transfer 60 credits or more cannot receive permissions to transfer additional course work.
