Notes:

- 1) Students who transfer to Temple with an A.A.S. in Tourism & Hospitality Management will need to complete the **45+ General Education** requirements necessary to graduate from Temple University.
- 2) Will be used to fulfill a THM major elective. A Temple advisor will process a DARS exception.
- 3) Students should complete MAT 106: Mathematic Applications. MAT 106 transfers to Temple as a Math lower level elective and satisfies the Quantitative Literacy (GQ) General Education requirement. Students who transfer without this course will need to complete a GQ course at Temple.
- 4) Students should use Temple's Transfer Equivalency Tool to select a transfer course that will satisfy the World Society (GG) General Education requirement at Temple. Students who transfer without a GG course will need to complete one at Temple.
- 5) Students should use Temple's Transfer Equivalency Tool to select a transfer course that will satisfy the Arts (GA) General Education requirement at Temple. Students who transfer without a GA course will need to complete one at Temple.
- 6) A portfolio review for HOS 297 will be required to determine if HOS 297 fulfills the STHM 3185 requirement. Upon approval, the Temple advisor will process a DARS exception
- 7) Students should use Temple's Transfer Equivalency Tool to select a transfer course that will satisfy the Science and Technology (GS) General Education requirement at Temple. Students who transfer without a GS course will need to complete one at Temple.
- 8) To see how courses might transfer, consult Temple's Transfer Equivalency Tool: http://admissions.temple.edu/transfer-equivalency-tool. Courses not included in the transfer tool may transfer, however, they would need to be evaluated.

- e) Per Temple's Transfer Policy for <u>Permission to Complete a Course at Another Institution after Matriculation</u>, students who transfer 60 credits or more cannot receive permission to transfer additional course work after matriculation.
