Notes:

- Students who complete the A.S. in Business Administration at MCCC are included in the MCCC-Temple GenEd-to-GenEd Transfer Agreement, and therefore, have satisfied all of the GenEd requirements at Temple.
- A combination of ACC 115 Financial Accounting (4 credits) and ACC 116 Managerial Accounting (3 credits) will satisfy the ACCT 2103 requirement through a DARS exception.
- MAT 140: Finite Math for Business comes in as a Lower Level Math Elective. Through DARS exception, the course will be equivalent to STAT 1001: Quantitative Methods for Business I and satisfies a major requirement.
- MAT 142: Calculus for Business comes in as a Lower Level Math Elective. Through DARS exception, the course will be equivalent to STAT 1102: Quantitative Methods for Business II and satisfies a major requirement.
- ACC150: Legal Environment of Business is equivalent to LGLS 1101 and will satisfy the BA 1103 requirement through a DARS exception.
- Students should select MGT 141: Principles of Risk Management as their Open Elective. MGT 141 transfers to Temple as RMI 2101: Introduction to Risk Management and satisfies a major requirement.

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The degree of Bachelor of Business Administration (B.B.A.) may be conferred upon a student by recommendation of the faculty and upon the satisfactory completion of a minimum of 124 semester hours of credit with a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 overall and in the major. A minimum of 124 credit hours will be earned in the following four requirement categories plus free electives if needed:

University General Education – Requirement fulfilled when student completes the Associate degree at MCCC.

Any updates for each academic year are available each summer when the new Bulletin is published.

- 20 (twenty) business courses (61 s.h.) are required as part of the lower- and upper-division foundation requirements for the B.B.A. program.
- In addition, a minimum of 6 (six) business courses must be completed in the major. In completing the courses in the major, students will become competent in understanding critical business concepts and the practice of ethical decision-making and demonstrate both effective written and oral communication and the ability to apply critical thinking to business problems.
- All Temple students must take a minimum of two writing-intensive courses. For B.B.A. program students, one of these courses will be BA 2196; the second will be a writing-intensive capstone course in the major. The writing capstone is normally taken in the students' final semester.

NOTE: Many upper-division foundation courses and major courses have prerequisites and some of these prerequisites also include grade requirements. Students are required to meet all prerequisites. Prerequisites will be strictly enforced, and the school reserves the right to de-enroll students from courses when prerequisites have not been met.
